



Chevron Looks to Move Delaware Acreage

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Chevron is putting some of its acreage in a Delaware Basin oil field on the sales block, according to advisory EnergyNet Indigo.

A listing on the EnergyNet's website shows that the major is looking to sell "certain oil and gas properties and related assets" in the Southeast Gomez Field in Pecos County, Texas.

The assets include 22,124 contiguous operated net acres in the southern part of the Delaware, with estimated conventional production of about 1,280 boe/d, according to EnergyNet's listing.

The acreage for sale also holds 264 net repeatable drilling locations and another 262 potential locations prospective to the Wolfcamp C and Bone Spring intervals, as well as in-place natural gas infrastructure.

According to a map published by the advisory, independents Diamondback Energy and Crescent Energy and privately held Gordy Oil operate near Chevron's Gomez position.

EnergyNet said that bids for the acreage are due by Nov. 9.

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
